I.O.M. MASS **ESCAPE** BID BY

Peel, I.O.M., Monday. A 35 - YARD long tunnel, leading under the barbed wire boundary fence of Peveril Camp, was discovered by the military guard early this morn-

ing.
It had been dug by British detainees.

Its discovery forestalled in the nick of time a sensational mass escape. The detainess, who include the Fascist rioters, gave their own game away.

A disturbance in the camp last night attracted the attention of a guardsman. Officers were brought from bed.

They found the detaines had broken into their own canteen and taken several bottles of light wine, with which they were toasting the completion of the tunnel.

The party developed into a brawl, in which bottles were used and two men injured.

From information which they received, the soldiers went at 2 a.m. to No. 13 Peveril Road, a house near the south-west corner of the camp, on the hill overlooking the bay.

TOBRUK PATROL
ACTIVITY

DURING the night of September 27-28 our patrols in the southern sector at Tobruk penetrated wire defences and attacked a strong post, inflicting a number of casualties on the enemy, states yesterday's Cairo communique.

In the same sector artillery engaged and dispersed enemy working parties.

In the frontier area also our fighting patrols continued to harass the enemy.

feet wide and ten feet deep. A ladder led to the bottom.

From here a horizontal tunnel led diagonally through the red sandy earth under Peveril Road.

BESIDE ALARM BELL

On the other side is a row of bungalows, occupied by Peel people. The tunnel passed under the steps of the first bungalow and came to the surface under cover of a privet hedge dividing the bungalow garden from that of another house used as a guardroom.

Two yards away stands the camp's tubular alarm bell, suspended from a tripod stand. The tunnel was wide enough to admit the passage of a man's body, and soldiers who crawled through it found that it was expertly made and shored up at intervals with timber.

The earth scooped from the tunnel had been scattered in small quantities on the gardens of several camp houses.

As a result of the night's disturbance eight men were confined to the camp' glass-house."

NEW CZECH TERROR WAVE Two Generals **Executed By** SLOWLY but surely the spirit of revolt is gathering throughout Nazi-dominated Europe, especially in those countries with a long history of struggle against oppressors, notably Czechoslovakia and Holland. Italy is as much "occupied" as any conquered country, and even the Iron hand of Fascism cannot hold down the wave of discontent that is sweeping the country.

Two former Czechoslovakia generals have died at the hands of the Nazi executioners under the first death sentences ordered by Reinhard Heydrich, chief Nazi "killer" in the new terror wave launched against the protectorate. launched against the protectorate.

According to German radio reports six death sentences were carried out by shooting. The victims were:

General Josef Bily, who was Commander-in-Chief of the Army in Bohemia, and General Hugo Vojta, former Deputy Commander-in-Chief of the Army Corps in Bratislava. Both were alleged to have prepared high treason," and four others suffered a similar fate for "sabotage" and "possession of arms."

The object of the conference was "to work out full details of co-operation between India and the Middle East regarding the anti-Axis front now established from Syria through Irak and Iran to the left flank of the Russian armies."
